Voting and Holiness is a collection of 15 essays by noted Catholic thinkers on how Catholics should participate in the political process. The authors—outstanding Catholic writers and theologians—explain how the Catholic tradition is too rich and nuanced to be pigeonholed into “single issues.” Topics include: abortion; common good; prudential judgment; Catholic bishops and the electoral process; religion and faith in the American political life; the real meaning

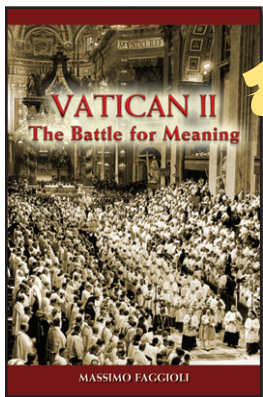
of “intrinsic evil” in the Catholic ethical tradition; voting as a potentially “sinful” act; conscience and citizenship; the indispensability of social justice; and participation in political life as a genuine act of holiness.

For many American Catholics, the election season turns into a wrenching time of spiritual extortion, in which political campaigners attempt to exploit the Catholic conscience in order to achieve victory at the polling booth. All too often, Catholic lay people and clergy go along with this, and hot-button political and social issues become litmus tests for fidelity to the Catholic faith. In the worst cases, threats to withhold the sacraments are directed at Catholics who have, in good conscience, put their support behind certain candidates.

Vatican II

The Battle for Meaning
Massimo Faggioli



The death of John Paul II and the election of Benedict XVI constituted undoubtedly two important elements in the broad theological and ecclesiastical landscape of the debate about Vatican II in the last few years. This change of pontificate has also nourished the journalistic and political dispute about Vatican II, its history and its legacy, and not only the historiographical and theological debate.

Brief accounts of the history of Vatican II have reached the public at large but the research on Vatican II is already proceeding forward and beyond the state of knowledge about the council reached at the end of the 90s. Even if some observers seem to be satisfied with the present knowledge, for twenty-first century church historians and theologians interested in understanding contemporary Catholicism in the light of Vatican II, the intellectual undertaking is still evolving.

The book gives a comprehensive presentation of the theological and historiographical debate about Vatican II. The attempt to go beyond “the clash of interpretations”—Vatican II as a rupture in the history of Catholicism on one side and the need to read Vatican II in continuity with the tradition on the other—is necessary indeed because the ongoing debate about Vatican II is largely misrepresented by the use of “clashing interpretations” as a tool for understanding the role of the council in present-day Catholicism.

Massimo Faggioli who holds a PhD from the University of Turin, is assistant professor of theology at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul (Minnesota). He is author of numerous articles on Vatican II and contemporary Catholicism.

Talking with Evangelicals

It is imperative that Catholics and Evangelicals move beyond mutual stereotypes they may have of one another. In this book, part one provides a history of Evangelicalism and an answer the question of who is an Evangelical? Part two takes up specific issues that distinguish Catholics and Evangelicals. The method is intended to affirm a common faith while providing mutual understanding of the doctrines and practices that divide the two communities. It is directed more to the Catholic reader who when confronted by an Evangelical Christian often does not know how to respond. Special attention is given to the experiential aspects of Christian life that often place the Catholic Christian at a disadvantage such as a "personal relationship with Christ." By exposing the underlying doctrinal differences and then appealing to the experiential register in both traditions, it is hoped that the book will equip Catholics to anticipate the fruitful possibilities of this dialogue. By taking up the challenge of Evangelicalism to Catholics as well as exposing some of its weaknesses, it is hoped that a more robust and ecumenical Catholic identity will emerge for the reader.

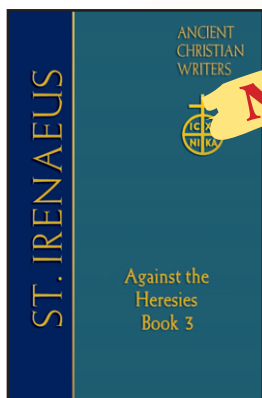

Jeanne Guyon was a seventeenth-century French mystic and Quietist, and a fascinating figure in the court of Louis XIV. Marginalized and ignored by French historians for two centuries after her death, her spiritual writings have nonetheless remained consistently popular among English-speaking audiences. Guyon had a strong influence among Quakers and Methodists in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, and her message of self-abnegation and the complete abandonment of individual desires in conformity to God's will continues to inspire many Christians today. This volume offers new, contemporary translations of her most important spiritual writings, including her *Short and Easy Method of Prayer* and her *Commentary on the Song of Songs*, never-before-translated letters of spiritual direction, and selections from her autobiography. The most comprehensive introduction to Guyon's life, theology, and historical context available in English, this book focuses on the religious and political conflicts responsible for her persecution and eventual imprisonment in the dreaded Bastille and examines her spiritual influences and theological contributions.

Dianne Guenin-Lelle teaches in the modern languages and cultures department at Albion College. She received her PhD in seventeenth-century French literature from Louisiana State University. **Ronney Mourad** teaches in the religious studies department at Albion College. He received his PhD from the University of Chicago Divinity School.

The magisterial *Adversus Haereses* by the second-century apologist and bishop Irenaeus of Lyons takes on the daunting task of refuting the heresies that had begun springing up in the Christian world. Book 3 of this five-book work is perhaps the most important of all: its overarching theme is to establish, as the rule of faith, that it is "one and the same God and Father who was announced by the prophets, handed down by the Gospel, whom we Christians worship and love with our whole heart as the Creator of heaven and earth and of all things in them." Irenaeus does this by mining the Gospels for every shred of evidence that he can marshal to prove his points. This new translation and introduction, based on the most up-to-date sources, is an invaluable addition to scholarship on the most significant work by one of the most renowned authors in early Christianity.

Matthew C. Steenberg is a deacon in the Russian Orthodox Church in Great Britain and Ireland and professor of theology at Leeds Trinity University College in Leeds, UK. He has authored many studies of early Christianity.



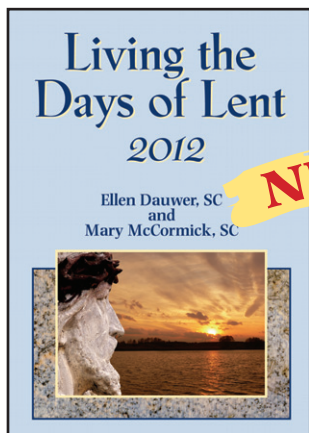

Ash Wednesday, February 22

From Ashes to Joy

"But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face...your Father who sees in secret will reward you."
—Matthew 6:17–18

For centuries, wearing ashes—a sign of public humiliation—acknowledges Christian penitents as sinners, those who have turned away from God. During the ritual we are reminded that we come from the earth and at the end of our lives we shall return to the earth.

But viewed in the context of Easter, Ash Wednesday should be a day of great joy. As the *Exultet* proclaims, "O happy fault!" Only by acknowledging our sinful nature and repenting for the falsities and excesses of our lives can we change. Only by turning toward God can we be assured that we are more than dust, that we have been ransomed, that far more awaits us than the grave.

Today, as I wear the ashes of humiliation, may I be joyful, for today is the acceptable time to turn to God, to accept the grace of God. Today is the day of salvation!

The Daily Cross

Then he said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it."
—Luke 9:23–24

In response to Peter's declaration that Jesus is the Messiah of God, Jesus teaches his followers what being the Messiah, the anointed one, really means. He breaks apart the traditional meaning: the king of Davidic lineage who will deliver Israel and restore its golden age in the worldly sense. Jesus teaches us that self-denial and suffering even to the point of death lead to freedom and everlasting life. By reversing the curse of the first man's disobedience, the Son of Man's obedience even unto death ransoms us as daughters and sons of God.

Today, as I reflect on the paradoxes of the Gospel message, may I joyfully accept the crosses in my life, viewing those burdens as my participation in God's salvation of the world.
