After a comprehensive introductory chapter, addressing four challenges of particular importance (how Pharisees, Jews, the Law, and the new covenant are presented), thirty key passages in the New Testament are analyzed, and several interpretations of each and one of these passages are discussed.

**Jesper Svartvik** is the former Krister Stendahl Chair of Theology of Religions, which included teaching and research both in Jerusalem and Lund, Sweden. He is currently canon theologian in the diocese of Karlstad, Church of Sweden. His areas of expertise include New Testament studies, interreligious relations in general, and Jewish-Christian relations in particular.

## Narsai

Mar Narsai (413-503 AD) is arguably the most significant theological author of an entire segment of Apostolic Christianity, the “Church of the East,” whose branches are now the Chaldean Catholic Church, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Malabar Catholic Church. Narsai’s metrical homilies are sources of deep Scriptural reflection, breathtaking poetic beauty, and unique, insightful theology. He is a Syriac-speaking author outside of Syria, an Eastern Christian voice farther east than Byzantium, a dyophysite Christologist without the “Nestorian” tinge of later Church of the East authors. Narsai is a writer outside our artificial boxes and categories, and for that reason an author worth our attention.

**Andrew Younan** is the first American-born priest of the Chaldean Catholic Church and is the founding rector of the only Chaldean rite seminary outside of Iraq. He teaches philosophy, theology, and biblical languages at John Paul the Great Catholic University, St. Patrick’s Seminary, and the University of St. Thomas in Houston. He completed his PhD at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley.

## The Book of Margery Kempe

Here is a synthesis of Margery’s many diverse spiritual practices, contextualising these both back in time to such late twelfth-/ thirteenth-century texts as *Ancrone Wisse*, and *The Katherine Group* (written for pious women), and also transnationally to those of her contemporary *mulieres religiosae* engaged in forming their identities, often remaining in the world and living as devout laywomen across Europe, and the author’s study serve as an Introduction to an illuminating modern English translation of *The Book of Margery Kempe* which, with its comprehensive endnotes and indices, takes account of the most recent and unnoticed findings in the field of fourteenth- and fifteenth-century affective devotion.

**Luke Penkett** is a prolific writer. Now a professed solitary monk and ordained priest in L’Église orthodoxe celtique, He is currently the secretary of the Margery Kempe Society, curator of the Margery Kempe Centre at King’s Lynn Minster. He has lectured and led quiet days and retreats all over the world.
