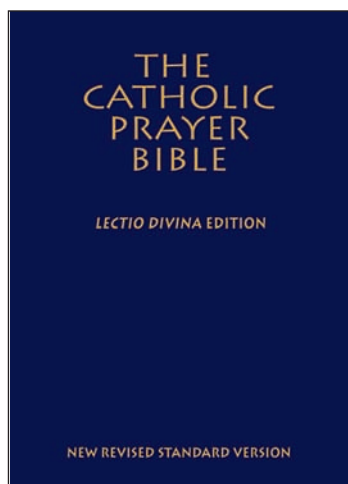

*Lectio divina*, the reflective reading of scripture, has long been a popular devotional practice in the Church from the earliest centuries. It consists of four steps:

- Read: A slow and thoughtful reading of a passage from the Bible
- Reflect: A time of reflection and thinking about the meaning of that text to me as a reader
- Pray: A period of prayer to God to bring the message or wisdom of the text to fruit in myself
- Act: A decision on what I should do as a result; that is, an action plan to change or improve my life

*Lectio divina* is simple enough to be done any place where there is some quiet or peace, and at any time of day when you can find a few minutes. It can last for as long or short as you wish to make it; you can spend three minutes or fifteen. And it is intended for everyone, for you—not just for those people you may think of as elite in some way: priests and religious, the very educated, or the very pious. Everyone—including you as you are right now—can find pleasure and spiritual enrichment in *lectio divina*.

This Bible, which is like no other, invites readers, whether individually or in groups, to read the Bible more completely and prayerfully. It is the perfect way to give the gift of prayer to yourself and to those you love.

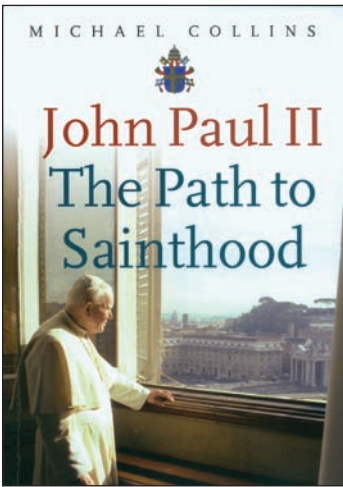

## John Paul II

The Path to Sainthood

For more than a quarter of a century Pope John Paul led the Catholic Church. The first non-Italian pope in more than four and a half centuries, his pontificate also had a wide impact outside the church.

Beatified just six years after his death, John Paul II remains an enigmatic figure. This book traces the life and controversial legacy of the first Polish pope in the two-thousand-year history of the papacy.

Fr. Michael Collins, a priest of the Archdiocese of Dublin, met the pope on numerous occasions over the course of twenty-six years. In this book, Collins traces the influences from Karol Wojtyła's youth and his ministry in Poland, which he adapted after his election to the Chair of Peter in 1978.

Fr. Collins brings the reader behind the scenes and gives a fascinating insight into the private life of the pope in the Vatican and introduces the reader to those who knew Karol Wojtyła intimately. Fr. Collins points out that most of the great initiatives of the pontificate, from strengthening ties with the Jewish people to the World Youth Days had already begun when he was a bishop in Poland.

**Michael Collins** is a priest of the Archdiocese of Dublin and author of several books, including *The Fisherman's Net* (Paulist Press). He appears regularly on television and radio in Ireland, Britain, and the U.S.

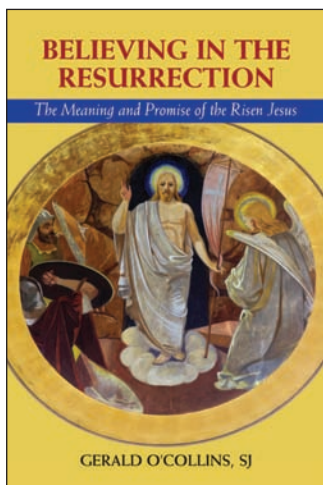

## Believing in the Resurrection

The Meaning and Promise of the Risen Jesus

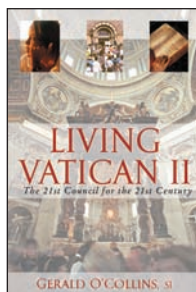
What does the resurrection of Jesus mean? Why believe in Jesus as risen from the dead? What promise does his resurrection hold out for human beings and their world? In facing these questions, this book begins by surveying what has been currently written and debated in the area of resurrection studies. After clarifying the meaning of the claim "Jesus is risen," it investigates the New Testament testimony to his postresurrection appearances and the discovery of his empty tomb. The appearances and the empty tomb led the first Christians to believe in the resurrection, a faith then confirmed by the descent of the Holy Spirit and the success of their mission to the world. Moving from the past, the book then reflects on the risen Jesus as a living presence today that has inaugurated the coming transformation of human beings and their world. The work ends by spelling out the moral implications of believing in Jesus' resurrection and hoping for our own.

Professor emeritus of the Gregorian University (Rome) and now adjunct professor of Australian Catholic University, **Gerald O'Collins** has so far published seven books and dozens of articles on the resurrection of Jesus. This published work, together with his lecture s around the world, have made him an international authority in the area of resurrection studies.

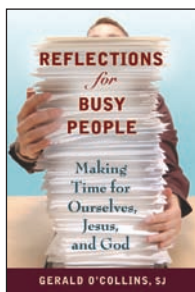

Our families and other close relationships are aspects of the environment or field in which we were shaped, but those families and relationships are contained in and shaped by the larger field of our society. This social environment is increasingly toxic, and much of the wounding we experience is at least as much societal and cultural as it is familial and interpersonal.

This book is the result of a several-year journey in which the authors were nearly overwhelmed and paralyzed by the toxic and insane aspects of our society. As they noticed what helped them, they began giving retreats on “healing the future” to thousands of people in various countries. The retreatants revealed that they, too, had felt overwhelmed and paralyzed by our social environment. The material and processes in this book are what helped them recover.

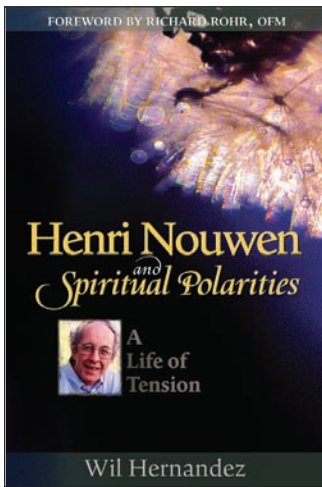

Based upon research in psychology, biology, spirituality, current affairs, and a wide variety of other fields, this book also includes simple healing processes to help face the future with confidence and hope, in touch with the inner wisdom that has already guided us through 13.7 billion years of evolution.

**Dennis, Sheila & Matt Linn** work together as a team, integrating physical, emotional, and spiritual wholeness, previously as hospital chaplains and therapists and currently in leading retreats and spiritual companionship. They are the authors of twenty-two books, which have sold over a million copies in English and have been translated into more than twenty languages. 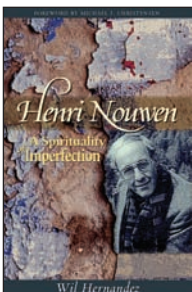

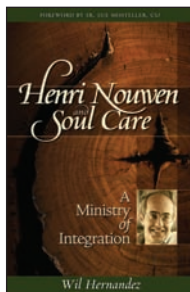

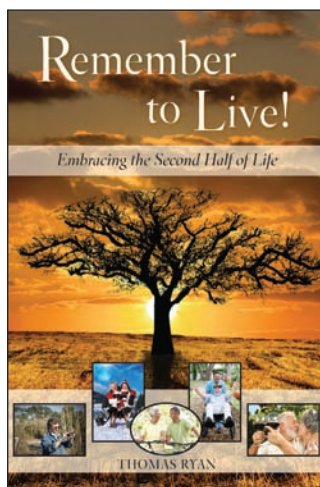

Embracing the Second Half of Life

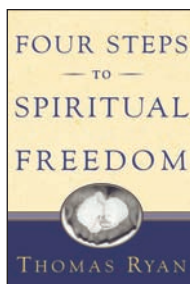

Topics covered include intimacy, money, anger, jealousy, careers, in-laws, handling frustration, and facing disenchantment.

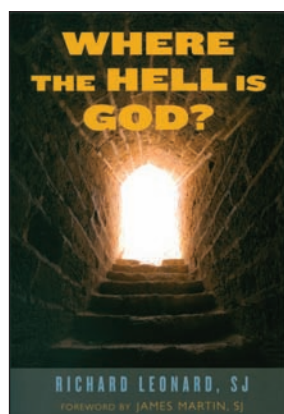

## Where the Hell Is God?

There are libraries of books on theodicy—the branch of philosophy and theology that wrestles with how God can allow a world to exist within which there is suffering and pain. The problem with these libraries is that they contain books that are generally written by professionals for their peers. *Where the Hell Is God?* combines the best of the professional's insights with the author's own experience and insights to speculate on how believers can make sense of their Christian faith when experiencing tragedy and suffering.

Starting with a very personal story of the author's sister being left a quadriplegic from a car accident twenty years ago, *Where the Hell Is God?* gently leads the reader through some “take-home” messages that are sane, sound, and practical. Among these messages are: God does not directly send pain, suffering, and disease. God does not punish us; God does not send accidents to teach us things, though we can learn from them; and God does not will earthquakes, floods, droughts, or other natural disasters.

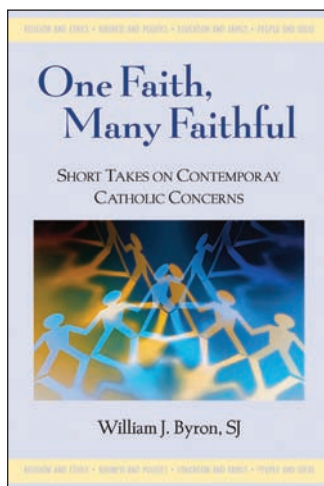

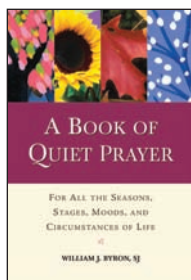

For all Catholics who want to move beyond the limited scope of contemporary debate and actually apply the ancient principles of their faith to difficult issues, this book will be indispensable.

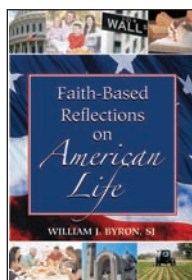

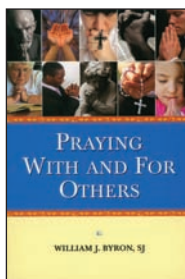

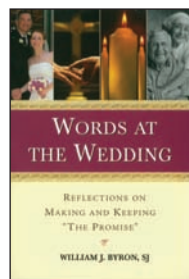

They may have varying degrees of familiarity with the Catholic Church and its main directions—ranging from a lot of knowledge to very little. This book provides an easy way to find out some basic things and organize any questions or issues they might have.

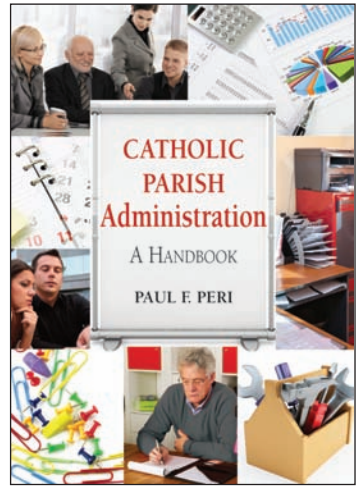

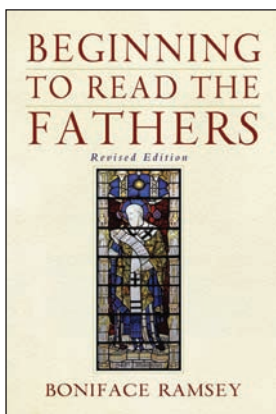

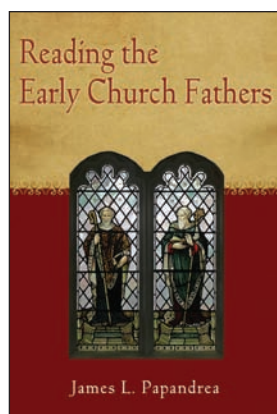
*Beginning to Read the Fathers* is an introduction to the church's earliest writers, preachers and theologians. It presupposes no more knowledge on the part of the reader than that the fathers existed and that their ideas might be important and perhaps even interesting. The book does not restrict itself to such topics as Christology and ecclesiology but includes other areas like martyrdom and prayer, which were highly important in shaping the mind and heart of the early church.

The material in this book is arranged thematically and follows a natural progression. Each chapter attempts to give a real taste of the subject in question by providing numerous selections from the writings of the fathers, some of them classic statements and some relatively obscure. Fathers from nearly all periods and traditions are cited. The author's opinions, although not nonexistent, are subordinate to the presentation of the fathers themselves. The work was written in a nontechnical style to be read both by beginners and by people with some expertise in the field. It concludes with suggestions for a patristics reading program for those who wish to pursue a study of the fathers in more depth.

**Boniface Ramsey** has taught extensively at Catholic University, Seton Hall University, and other institutions of higher learning. His specialty is the fathers of the church and he has published widely in this field. He is the pastor of St. Joseph's Church in New York City.

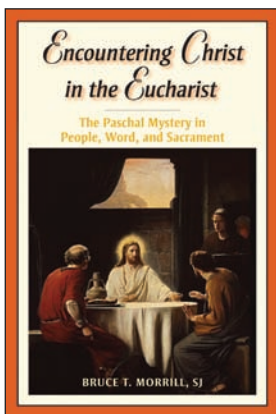
"This is the book I wish I had when I was first studying the early church and the development of Christianity," says author James Papandrea. *Reading the Early Church Fathers* introduces the reader to the primary sources of church history, with commentary that will help the reader make sense of the theological/Christological trajectory that led the church from the New Testament era, through the apologists, to the development of the major doctrines of the church. Papandrea's treatment of the early church fathers is unique in that he situates his discussion against the social and cultural context of the Roman Empire and its relationship to the church, especially with regard to the effect of the persecutions on the church.

*Reading the Early Church Fathers* does not provide actual excerpts of the works under discussion; instead, it directs the reader to the primary sources available on the Internet, resources that will be updated regularly. The result, for all students of the early church, is a unique and unprecedented "big picture" of early Christian literature.

**Jim Papandrea** received his PhD in the history and theology of the early church from Northwestern University. Dr. Papandrea teaches early and medieval church history at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois. He is also a consultant in the area of adult faith formation, and a featured speaker at parishes in the Chicago area.

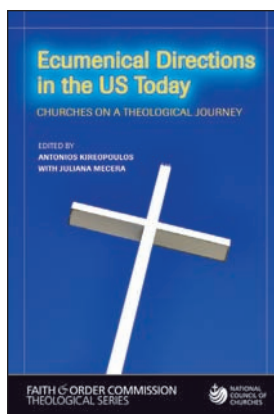
If changes in the church's liturgical practice were the most obvious development of Vatican II to be noticed by the faithful in the pew, then inevitably, shifts in eucharistic theology were not far behind. The previous focus on Christ's presence in the sacrament itself under the species of bread and wine and the attendant forms of worship that this spawned have gradually yielded to deepening insights into the manifold ways in which Christ is present among the faithful. Drawing upon the best of recent biblical, historical, and theological sources, Bruce Morrill unfolds how the divine Spirit of Jesus works through ways Christ is present in the celebration of the Eucharist—in the assembly, presiding minister, biblical word, and ritual sacrament.

Mindful of challenges inherent in eucharistic theologies within and among church traditions and communities, Morrill orient's his theology on two key principles from Vatican II's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy: the celebration of the liturgy as participation in the paschal mystery, and the multiple bodily, symbolic ways Christ is present in the ritual celebration. In the process, he sheds new light on such topics as sacrifice, covenant, divine presence and absence, and the tradition's relationship to Judaism.

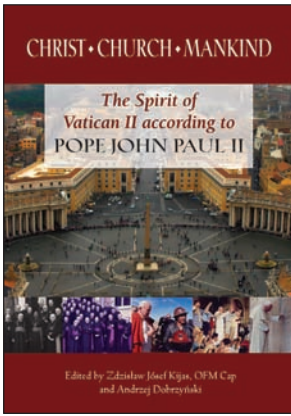
MADELEVA LECTURE IN SPIRITUALITY

Religion has played an enormous role in contemporary politics and in the discussions of war and peace, identity and tradition, authoritarianism and democracy. In the Madeleva Lecture for 2011 Kwok Pui-lan, one of the most prominent postcolonial feminist theologians, discusses the future of interfaith dialogue. She shows how globalization has impacted interreligious relationships and dialogue and argues that the future of interfaith dialogue must include those marginalized voices that have not been invited to the table, especially women. In discussing issues on gender and interfaith dialogue, she explores concerns that have been raised by women, such as the Orientalist construction of religious difference, reciprocity, and misappropriation, and multiple identities and hybridity. Finally, a central focus for interfaith dialogue is peacebuilding, and in this context Dr. Kwok explores the concept of polydoxy, which goes beyond the logic of the One to embrace multiplicity and relationality.

**Kwok Pui-lan** is the William F. Cole Professor of Christian Theology and Spirituality at Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and in 2011 was president of the American Academy of Religion. A pioneer in Asian feminist theology and postcolonial theology, Professor Kwok has participated in interfaith dialogues in Asia and the USA.

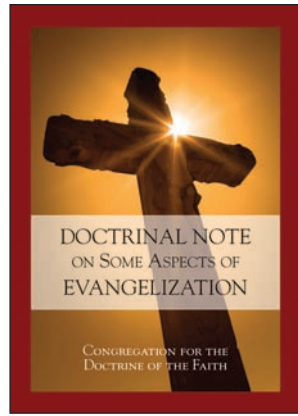

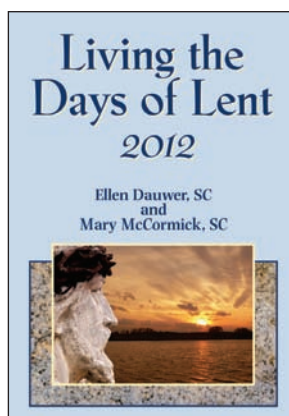

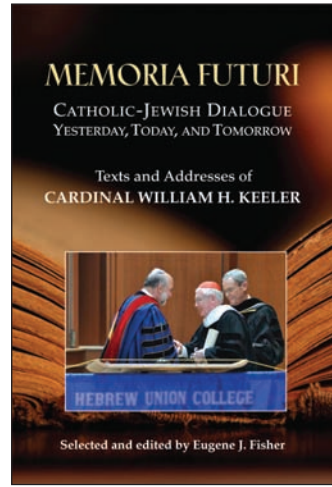

Cardinal William H. Keeler was for many years the Episcopal Moderator for Catholic-Jewish Relations for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. ## St. Jerome

Commentary on Ecclesiastes

Jerome's scholarly achievement was remarkable, and this early work of his is both a fine tribute to his learning and a not always creditable revelation of his character. He learned Hebrew from a Jewish biblical scholar, to the point where he could make valuable three-way comparisons between the Old Latin text with which he and his readers were familiar the Greek Septuagint, and the Hebrew. He had also read widely in the works of Greek exegetes, of which he made critical use in this commentary, often comparing different interpretations and providing his own. His own pride in his education shows itself in several quotations from classical authors. This translation aims to render the biblical text, with which he prefaces each section of his commentary, in English as literal as his Latin—perhaps that of an Old Latin version. The translation of Jerome's commentary aims at reproducing his own fluent, sometimes rather rhetorical, style; but it has often been necessary, for a modern readership, to break up his typically long sentences. The commentary shows full awareness of modern work on Ecclesiastes and provides details of Jerome's numerous sources. An appendix puts the Latin text onto a sounder footing than any yet published, with use of the unique fifth-century manuscript in the Würzburg University library. All Hebrew, Greek, and Latin words referred to in the commentary are translated, and the Hebrew and Greek ones are also transliterated.

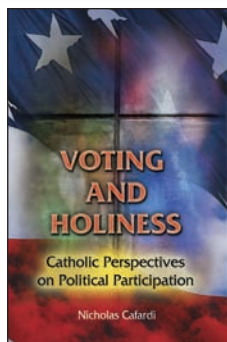
